#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As we begin the month of April, we are in the last two weeks of the season of Lent. Our steps during this month take us ever closer to the foot of the Cross of Calvary. On Sunday, April 7<sup>th</sup> during our 10:30 worship service, the children of our Sunday School will be sharing their joyous music with us. It is good to have the youth of our church share in worship in many different ways.



Palm Sunday worship will feature the Procession with Palms with our children participating in the procession. It is the time for us to hear the story of the Passion of our Lord according to the Gospel of St. Luke. This day the mood of worship changes rapidly from one of joyful "Hosannas" to the march to the Cross of Calvary.

Remember that during Holy Week there will not be a mid-week worship service on Wednesday. Instead we will gather on Holy Thursday (Maundy Thursday) at 7:30 PM to recall the institution of the Lord's Supper and the stripping of the altar at the close of worship in preparation for Good Friday.

Good Friday Worship begins at 7:30 PM as we gather around the Good Friday Cross with our Tenebrae Service of Worship and the gradual extinction of the light of Christ until our worship time together ends in total darkness.

Holy Saturday finds us hosting our annual Easter Egg Hunt beginning at 10:00 AM for all the children of the Exeter community. We are in need of donations of candy which can be placed in our plastic eggs. Also, volunteers are needed to make this annual event a success. Easter Sunday will begin for us at 8:00 AM with the Festival Service of the Resurrection and Holy Communion. Easter Breakfast will be served in Fellowship Hall from 9:00 to 10:00 AM. If you and your family have not shared in worship recently, join us as we share Word and Sacrament of the Risen Lord, Jesus Christ.
