

As I've mentioned, I am a spiritual director. For over a decade, I have been meeting with individuals face to face, by remotely to accompany them on their journey with God. I'm also blessed to teach others this practice one weekend a month.

I think of spiritual direction as my walking alongside someone. Sometimes a rare bird flies by, and the person might be led to ask questions about the bird. But sometimes the person is so busy, or so used to the bird, that they don't notice how unusual this bird is. Or the world feels so heavy that it's hard to even lift your head to see the bird.

As a spiritual director, I listen with the person, paying attention for those rare bird-sightings. I then gently invite my companion to notice what is around them, asking questions that emerge. God is the ultimate Director; my calling is to sit with another so they can hear God. Sometimes God speaks in fire and earthquake, other times in silence and the ordinary.

Beyond wanting you to know about this important part of my life, I write this because being a spiritual director is who I am, not just what I do. I listen a lot. I am as likely to be quiet as to talk, and when I do talk, I ask questions as much as answer them.

It is important that you know this, because as Duke Divinity School professor C. Kavin Rowe writes in his article, "Leadership and the Discipline of Silence," We are not accustomed to thinking of leaders as those who know how to be silent. We want them to put out a statement, give a response, open the conversation, interpret the recent news and so forth. And this, of course, is perfectly reasonable. In some ways, it is the gift and responsibility of leaders to do these things.

But, he continues, "the world of fast and loud often prevents us from hearing the quieter sounds from the depths. But these sounds are often those that we most need to hear when we want to tell the truth wisely."

May God bless us as we seek to be attentive to that rarest of birds, in the world and in us:

Come, Holy Spirit, Heavenly Dove!


Highlights from Assembly 2019

The Assembly heard reports from the synod officers: Vice Prevident Kristen Edelman-Weiner Secretary The Revi Carl Shankweiler; and Treasurer Dunald Dilliman. The 2020 Spending Plan was adopted with a total oridget for next year of \$1,984,400, of which \$869,500 is sent to the ELCA for Mission Support; and \$148,000 is given to various church related institutions such as Boar Croek Camp, Uniter Lutheran Seminary Muhlenberg College, PA Conference of Charunes, and LAMPa.

The Assembly accreted two resolutions. The first was a major revision of "Continuing Resolutions" offered by Synod Council to bring them up to date with current practice. The second was a resolution that the Youth, Young Adult, and Family Ministry Team address the need for synodical youth leadershipt and that this Team work with the Transition Team that will report to the new bishop in 2020.
