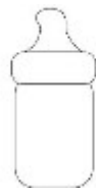
It is a fun night with a great cause. Our meals have been a blessing to our members and the families and neighbors of our members.

OCTOBER GIVING TREE: MARY'S SHELTER

Mary's Shelter provides temporary shelter and social services to homeless, pregnant young women and their children. In a secure and loving environment, each young woman is guided and encouraged to develop the skills necessary to live independently in the community. They also provide pregnancy and parenting support services to low-income families from Berks, Lehigh, Northampton, and Schuylkill Counties.

In 2016, Mary's Shelter became the site for the Greater Reading Berks Diaper Bank. The social ministry committee is requesting **DIAPERS OF ANY SIZE** to support this valuable community resource. Diapers may be put in the parlor at the Giving Tree collection site.

We also encourage you to participate in the **BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN**. All you need to do is pick up a baby bottle, use it to collect loose change, and return it to church by the end of October. This activity helps Mary's Shelter in two ways; first, it raises funds for much needed baby supplies, such as diapers and formula. Second, it raises awareness among family, friends, and community members who ask about the baby bottle in your home, school, or at work.

We hope you will join us in supporting Mary's Shelter in their mission of compassion.






THE GREAT THANKSGIVING
